Urgent This Week:

- Use extra caution when opening Microsoft Excel documents for at least the next two weeks. A couple of vulnerabilities have popped up that put Excel users at risk of attack. Most importantly, don't open any Excel spreadsheets you receive by e-mail unless you expected to get them. Run a virus scan of every single Excel file you receive before opening it.
- Keep an eye on your credit record. The recent data losses at the VA, USDA, and in Nebraska all highlight the fact that you're not in complete control of your own personal data, but you are capable of taking matters into your own hands to protect yourself.

Important to Do Every Week:

- 🕝 Run a backup of your important computer files and store it in a safe location.
- Update your anti-spyware software and run it. If you need free anti-spyware software, visit http://www.safer-networking.org/en/spybotsd/ and download Spybot Search and Destroy.
- Opdate your anti-virus software and run it. If you need free anti-virus software, visit http://free.grisoft.com and download AVG Anti-Virus.
